

Vital Villages Scheme

The questionnaire process of the Parish Plan is now complete and the results have been analysed. The return rate was 67% for the Bagots ward which is a very pleasing result and thanks go out to everyone who took time and interest in completing questionnaires.

Action groups in each parish are being asked to review the results. The content of the returned questionnaires provided many good suggestions that can be developed into future community projects.

This stage is by no means the end of the consultation process and any further contributions or views are most welcome. As stated before, the Parish Plan will be designed to reflect the views of the community, with a time scale of between October and December 2003.

To ensure the Parish Plan reflects the views of those people who live and work in the Parish, a series of public meetings are to be held, in which the results of the questionnaires will be discussed. There will be an opportunity to allow people to give their views on local issues. The meeting for Abbots Bromley residents will be held at the Village Hall on Tuesday 4th November at 7.30pm.

Community First Responder (CFR)

Those of you who went to Show Day will probably remember some paramedics standing at a stall. Some of you will also remember writing your names down as "interested". Well, now is the time for anybody and everybody who wants to give service to our community to book Wednesday 22nd October, Village Hall, 7.30pm in their diary. This is when we will be holding the inaugural meeting of the Abbots Bromley First Responder Group.

Just to briefly remind you, the purpose of a CFR group is to supplement the Staffordshire Ambulance Service in rural areas where the reality is that response times are at their longest. The CFRs therefore support their local community by bringing trained assistance more quickly. They are all volunteers from the community they serve and will be trained to an appropriate standard by the Ambulance Service. The Abbots Bromley group will be based in the village and probably cover something like a 5 mile radius.

We're sure that as you think about it, you will appreciate the benefit of a CFR group in our community. If you're interested in being part of either the operational side or the support/fundraising team then please come to the meeting. The Parish Council is in support of this initiative as is the Vital Villages project but it cannot work without the active support of the community so please come and find out more on 22nd October.
