

## **Tarmac Trophy comes to Abbots Bromley**

## **Quality Council Certificate Presented**

In July, Abbots Bromley Parish Council celebrated the end of a two year journey when they were presented with the certificate of Quality Council status. This award demonstrates that the Council are representative, in touch with their community, competent and capable of taking on an enhanced role. Since 2003 the Council has worked steadily towards this goal with a process of self-assessment, making changes as necessary, ending with a successful submission. Clerk, Eric Roy, obtained a distinction in the Certificate in Local Council Administration (CiLCA) - the specific qualification for Clerks – in order to satisfy one of the many tests for Quality status. Speaking on behalf of the Parish Council, Chairman Councillor Philip Charles said: "We are delighted to receive this independent recognition of the quality of our work and we believe that it reflects the dedication and hard work put in by both Clerk and Councillors. The process of preparing our application helped challenge our thinking about how the Council should operate and required us to make some positive changes to the way we work, including the introduction of regular surgeries. However, we have no reason to be complacent, and recognise that there will always be further opportunities to improve the way that we communicate and consult with the electorate. We therefore hope to build on this success rather than rest on our laurels."

#### **Village Hall Drive**

With the help of grants from East Staffordshire Borough Council, Staffordshire County Council, the Parish Council, the Bowls and Tennis clubs and the Show committee, the access drive and parking area to the Village Hall has been refurbished providing safer access to our village amenities.

#### **Footpath Map**

A new notice board displaying a map of the village illustrating the footpaths and local walks in the area has been erected near the Buttercross. Giving information and advice to tourists and locals alike. This was provided with support from Staffordshire County Council and Abbots Bromley Footpath Society.

#### **Abbots Bromley Show Committee**

The appeals for new Show Committee members following the 2004 Show did not result in any new volunteers. Consequently there were insufficient people to organise a Show for this year and there are no current plans for next year. It has therefore been decided to make further donations out of the funds held. These donations are as follows:Village Hall as contribution to renovation of driveway -£500 First Responders £100, Under 5's play area £100, Children's Christmas Party £300 (TBC). The party is to be held at the Village Hall on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> December. Watch for further details. This will leave some £300 remaining which it is proposed to retain as a basis of funding for when hopefully at some time in the future another Show will be organised.
